FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2020 was a year of profound worldwide change. It also illustrated to everyday Americans just how impactful forced deprivation and involuntary isolation could be to a person's normal existence. While these were thankfully temporary conditions for the populations of wealthier developed countries, many underdeveloped countries experienced far greater hardships pre-COVID. Following this pandemic, it is going to become that much more difficult for these nations to rise above already crippling levels of poverty and eventually become self-sufficient.

In his October 3, 2020 encyclical entitled <u>Fratelli Tutti</u> ("All Brothers"), Pope Francis referenced the words of his chosen namesake Saint Francis of Assisi when he said: "Of the counsels Francis offered, I would like to select the one in which he calls for a love that transcends the barriers of geography and distance, and declares blessed all those who love their brother 'as much when he is far away from him as when he is with him.'" As His Holiness continues to remind us, we are all God's children. It is both our sacred duty, as well as our privilege, to lend a hand to anyone who is suffering in circumstances that are much less fortunate than ours.

For the past 64 years, the Loyola Foundation has devoted most of its resources to financially assisting underserved overseas Catholic communities. This philanthropic work is immeasurably expanded upon by contributions from other like-minded organizations, both in the United States and abroad.



Albert G. McCarthy, Jr. Founder and first President of the Loyola Foundation




AN ILLUSTRIOUS TRUSTEE

PAUL R. DEAN (1918-2008)

An original member of the Loyola Foundation's Board of Trustees, Paul R. Dean was a close friend and business associate of founder Albert G. McCarthy, Jr.

Born in Youngstown, Ohio, Mr. Dean grew up in modest circumstances. His father managed to provide a college education for all his sons, including Paul, who graduated from Youngstown State and completed two years of law school at Georgetown University before joining the Navy in 1942. In 1944, the Navy chose him as one of 38 people to take a course at Harvard Business School on terminating war contracts. He was assigned to Detroit, where he took law classes at the University of Detroit before returning to Georgetown and completing his legal education.



Upon his graduation in 1946, Mr. Dean clerked for a D.C. circuit court judge. In 1947, he became one of four young lawyers who were hired as full-time faculty members of the Georgetown University Law School. In 1954, he was appointed dean of the law school.

Since 1928, the law school had been overseen by a Jesuit regent. The regents governed through a handpicked group of executive faculty members. No professor had tenure; teaching loads were high; the faculty were overwhelmingly Catholic and graduates of Georgetown. With support from the new university president chosen by the Jesuit's Maryland province, Mr. Dean was able to enact major reforms such as the appointment of a budget committee, ending the exclusiveness of the executive faculty and drafting a constitution that made the dean of the law school the "sole administrative head and the school's official representative."

During his tenure, Mr. Dean improved the school's academic standing and "committed Georgetown to becoming one of the nation's elite law schools." He hired quality faculty members, materially improved the curriculum, and moved the school building from dilapidated facilities to a more suitable location. He also rebranded the Georgetown Law School as the Georgetown University Law Center. He stepped down as Dean of the Law Center in 1969.

Mr. Dean was a Loyola Foundation Trustee from 1957 until he voluntarily retired in 2006. He served as Board Vice-President from 1976 to 2004. During his Foundation service, he assisted with codifying many of the basic tenets by which the Foundation operates to the present day. He also recommended the names of several quality Board members, such as Reverend William J. Byron, S.J., the previous President of Catholic University. Mr. Dean's late daughter, Patricia Dean, served as a Foundation Trustee from 2002 to 2004.

On December 11, 1999, the Loyola Foundation Board of Trustees approved a special grant for assistance with the construction of a new Jesuit Residence at Georgetown University. The conference room at the residence was named in honor of Paul R. Dean.

MILESTONES 2019 – 2020

JANUARY 12, 2019

Reverend William J. Byron, S.J. gives a brief report on the Foundation's 60th anniversary grant to Cristo Rey Philadelphia High School. The Board establishes the permanent existence of three standing committees: the Executive Committee, the Investment Governance Committee and the Finance Committee. The Trustees discuss and adopt a Foundation operating document, detailing exactly how the Foundation will operate in the future and expectations about the way its members will interact.

JUNE 8, 2019

Three 4th generation family descendants, Addy Bramson, Cole Page and Marianne McCarthy, audit the Board meeting. Sister Mary Louise Stubbs, Executive Director for Daughters of Charity International Project Services, gives an informational presentation to the Trustees about the work of Daughters of Charity sisters worldwide. The Trustees discuss establishing the new designation of Emeritus Trustee.

JANUARY 11, 2020

Three 4th generation family descendants, Victoria Bramson, Cole Page and Luis Muniz, audit the Board meeting. Ms. Joan Rosenhauer, Executive Director of Jesuit Refugee Service USA, gives an informational presentation to the Trustees about the international activities of Jesuit Refugee Service. The Board discusses mission related investing. The Trustees vote to invest a portion of its equity portfolio in a Socially Responsible Investing index that is driven by USCCB standards. The goal is to have all the equity portion of the Foundation's investment portfolio allocated to an SRI vehicle within the foreseeable future

JUNE 27, 2020

Due to COVID related restrictions, the Board convenes a hybrid meeting. Four Trustees attend in-person and the rest of the Board participates via Zoom conferencing. Three 4th generation family descendants, Victoria Bramson, Cole Page and Marianne McCarthy, are present to audit the Board meeting. Fourth generation family descendant Luis Muniz participates by Zoom. Mr. Mauricio Vivero, Executive Director for Friends of Caritas Cuba, gives an informational presentation to the Trustees about Cuba and the work of Friends of Caritas Cuba. The Board adopts several proposals presented by Trustee Amy Hattler Page: expanding the participation of founder Albert G. McCarthy, Jr.'s descendants; criteria for non-family Board members; establishing parameters for Emeritus Trustees and authorizing the sale of the Foundation's current office headquarters.

CUBA TRIP

EXPLORATION OF CUBAN CULTURE AND PHILANTHROPY

In January, 2020, Loyola Foundation Trustees Hilary Hattler, Amy Page, Greg McCarthy and Annamarie Glaize, the Foundation's Grant Manager, accompanied a small group of interested philanthropists on a trip to Havana, Cuba organized by Mr. Mauricio Vivero, the Chief Executive Officer of Friends of Caritas Cuba. Located in Boston, Friends of Caritas Cuba is the official United States representative and primary outside funder for Caritas Cuba, the humanitarian and social services arm of the Catholic Church in Cuba.



The goal of this trip was to promote philanthropy for the Catholic Church in Cuba and acquaint first time visitors to Cuba. Mr. Vivero wanted people who were initially visiting Cuba to experience its arts and culture, in addition to being exposed to the charitable work of Caritas Cuba. Previous organized trips had been for a week and spent a great deal of time visiting programs in the rural areas. The participants were usually older Catholics who were volunteers and donors to Friends of Caritas Cuba. Visiting the rural areas was part of how they wished to express their Catholicism.

During their brief stay in Havana, the 2020 group visited the Ludwig Foundation of Cuba, which is a non-government non-profit grantmaking organization on the island. Its mission was to protect, preserve, and promote Cuban artists, both in Cuba as well as internationally. There was a tour of the Nostalgic Cars Restoration Garage, one of the few privately owned businesses in Havana. American automobiles from the 40s and 50s are essential for everyday transportation of Cubans. Vintage cars are also utilized as taxis to service the tourist trade. The trip provided opportunities to visit the studio of Esterio Segura Mora, a prominent Cuban artist, and the Altamira Art Loft, an alternative studio, or "open gallery," which allowed artists to offer their work for sale without extra charges for dealers' commissions.

CUBA TRIP continued

The Loyola Foundation contingent made its own side trip to Santa Teresa Monastery, a cloistered community of Contemplative Carmelite Sisters. In January 2020, the Loyola Foundation made a grant of \$20,000 for the purchase of bakery machines and equipment. With approval from the Metropolitan Archdiocese of San Cristobal de la Habana, the sisters had started a modest host making business at the monastery.

On their final day in Havana, the trip participants were shown two projects sponsored by Caritas Cuba, the preschool and elderly programs. Established in 1991 by the Conference of Catholic Bishops, Caritas Cuba is the largest organized effort providing social services to the Cuban people. Caritas Cuba collaborates on a local level with other groups, as well as working closely with the Cuban government. Friends of Caritas Cuba hosted a tour of Guardera Padre Usera Daycare Center, which offers daycare services for at-risk families so the mothers can go to work.



In addition, there was a visit to a senior center at Iglesias y Convento de la Merced. Due to the high number of emigrants, Cuba has the oldest median age in Latin America. Seniors participating in the La Merced program are provided with hot meals, haircuts, manicures, and special outings. The program gave elderly people, who mostly lived alone, the ability to socialize and participate in group religious activities.

In a relatively short time, the Cuban excursion provided the participants with an opportunity to learn a great deal about Cuban culture, art, and philanthropy. If future relations between the United States and Cuba improve, there could be the distinct possibility of a corresponding increase in foreign aid to the Cuban people.




